THANK YOU GLEN COVE!

Richie has played with and for a great many famous celebrities, I was incredibly humbled to be on the same stage as Richie and that famous saxophone. Eva Casale—the runner of 7 marathons in 7 days, and fellow Veteran advocate, led the Pledge of Allegiance. Fr. Gabriel Rach, pastor of St. Patrick's church gave an invocation and my fellow Glen Cove Rotary member, Reverend Richard Wilson gave a benediction.

As a former teacher who wishes to involve Glen Cove students in my administration, I was thrilled to have 8th grader Michael Renga, President of the National Middle School Honor Society, give a speech at my inauguration; happy to report that Michael upstaged me. I was blessed to have Shye Roberts of the Select Chorale sing God Bless America. And so thankful to Zac Gotterbarn, another Glen Cove High School student, videotaping the entire ceremony!

On another note, a covid testing site has been set up at the City Stadium. They are doing Rapid, PCR, and antibody tests. 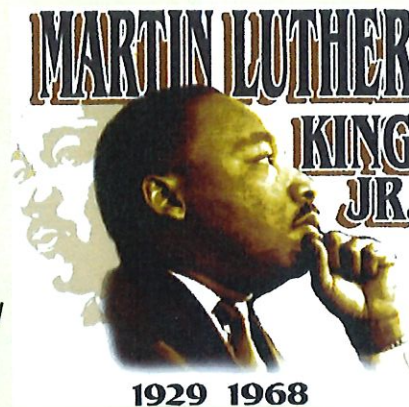
COVID TESTING SITE

GLEN COVE VETERAN MONUMENTS

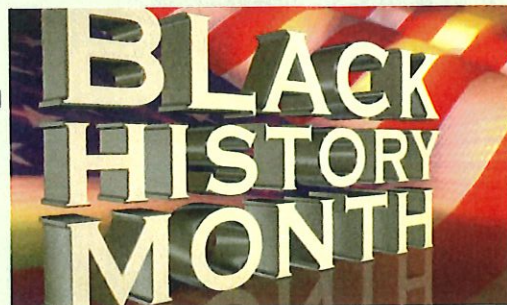

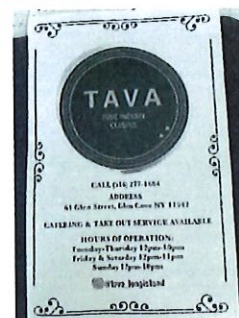

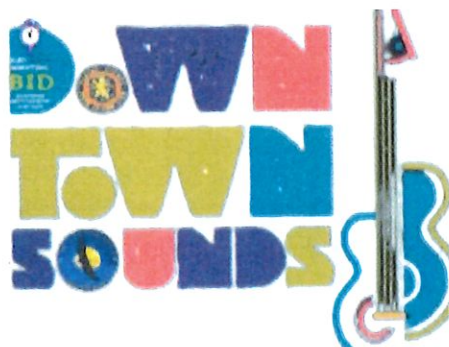

From Glen Cove Code Enforcement

- Permits are required for garage/yard sales. NO SIGNS are to be posted on public property. Prior to garage sale, you must obtain a garage sale permit (\$15 fee) at the Glen Cove Clerk's Office at City Hall.
- Dog Licenses: Dogs over the age of 4 months are required to be licensed. Under the authority of New York State Department of Agriculture and Markets, the City Clerk's Office issues dog licenses. Owner must provide proof of current rabies vaccination and documentation of spaying or neutering (if applicable). Dog licenses are to be renewed yearly.
